Dear Students and Families of Williams Elementary School!

I hope this letter finds you all enjoying the gorgeous summer! You are probably having fun swimming, playing games and going on fun adventures. I have had fun spending time with my family. We've been fishing, working in our garden, hiking and enjoying the sunshine. It has been a wonderful summer. Don't forget to finish filling out your Sizzling Summer Passports. We will have a special assembly when we return to recognize all students that have successfully completed the Sizzling Summer Passport. You still have time to complete the passport if you haven't started yet. You can download the passport from the district website or pick one up at Open House to fill in as you reflect on your summer activities. All passports must be returned to school by: **Friday, September 6**.

Welcome families new to Williams and returning families to a new school year. We are looking forward to a productive partnership with you to ensure our children can achieve their highest potential. We recognize that in order to be successful in school, our children need support from both home and school. We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education.

Below are our goals for the 2019-2020 school year:

- 1. We will continue our work on increasing our attendance rate of all students by reducing chronic absenteeism and students arriving late to school. "Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing ten percent or more of the academic year for any reason, including excused and unexcused absences, suspensions and time missed due to changing schools. Based on a 180 day school year, that means a student would miss about 18 days per year," (attendanceworks.org). In the 2017-2018 school year 12.72% of our students were chronically absent. Last year, 8.68% of our students were chronically absent. As you can see we improved by 4.04%! Our success with this goal was truly a team effort. We appreciate all of your support and are looking forward to working with you again this year.
- 2. To increase mathematics and reading assessment results. We will analyze assessment data in the areas of math and reading and increase the number of students who are not/partially proficient to meeting grade level expectations.

This year we will be incorporating a 25 minute W.I.N. (What I Need) block three days a week that will be dedicated to helping our students grow. This block of time will focus on supporting students with math concepts, providing enrichment opportunities, giving students opportunities to participate in book talks, teaching students about coding and supporting students with social skills and conflict resolution. We are excited about this new addition to our schedule.
